After completing their first battle, players can unlock username and Splashtag customization. In Splatoon 3, players can now personalize their username after the first battle is based on the Switch username, but it's no longer tied to it. Players have control over the emotes they use upon winning battles, and the winning team in a battle is now only shown, with the losing team's players performing their emotes. Players can select from four Splatfest regions: Americas/Oceania, Europe, Japan, and SE Asia/Hong Kong, which also determines the plaza art and Top 100 they see. Choosing Japan prompts a warning about language support for Splatfests outside of Japan. Players can choose between two X Battle divisions: Tentatek and Takoroka, once per season. Inklings and Octolings have new gear with customization options. New brands, such as Barazushi, Emberz, Z+F, Enperry, Forge, Krak-On, and Toni Kensa, offer high-quality technical wear, patchwork clothing, street-savvy gear, and more. Locations include Alterna, Inkadia, and the Splatlands. The new features in Splatoon 3 include Tricolor Turf War with a unique twist. Anarchy Battle mode replaces Ranked Battles, featuring all four modes on rotation with the returning rank system. Triple Inkstrike: Players can throw sticky beacons to launch Inkstrike with giant vertical tornadoes of ink. Tacticooler: A deployable fridge providing temporary buffs for players who drink its contents. Super Chump: Allows players to launch decoys that explode after a short time, leaving behind Super Jump markers. Splatoon 3 brings fresh new abilities and powers to the game, including the Kraken Royale special, which turns players into giant squids or octopuses, allowing them to attack with powerful dash attacks. The Triple Splashdown special is also a reworked version of its Splatoon 2 counterpart, summoning two giant fists made of ink that deal additional damage to opponents. The game's soundtrack features a mix of new and returning artists, including C-Side, Front Roe, Damp Socks feat. Off the Hook, Yoko & the Gold Bazookas, H2Whoa, Chirpy Chips, Riot Act, and ω-3, each contributing unique songs to the game. Deep Cut is the new idol band, drawing inspiration from various traditional cultures, and their music can be heard during Splatfests. The Splatoon 3 Expansion Pass promises several free post-launch updates, introducing new abilities, stages, and gameplay mechanics. The Splatoon series' theme of number three is a recurring element throughout the game. This can be seen in the game's season changes, which occur every three months and include new content such as weapons, stages, and additional items. The Splatoon 3: Expansion Pass, released in two waves, adds to this theme with its new story mode and character designs referencing the number three. In-game elements like Agent 3, the protagonist of Return of the Mammalians, and the default Inkling hairstyle, which is a braid made from twisting three strands of hair, also reference the number. The music of bands C-Side and Deep Cut feature song titles that include "three" in their names, while character designs and patterns on items like Big Man's back resemble multiple "3"s. Weapons introduced in the game are named after and associated with the number three, such as the Tri-Stringer, Trizooka, Triple Inkstrike, and Triple Splashdown. Additionally, gear items like the Tri-Shred Tee and the Octobot King L3.Gs model reference this theme. In the game mode Return of the Mammalians, multiple elements are connected to the number three, including treasure collection, time limits in final boss battles, and rewards for completing challenges. The game's progression system also incorporates the number three, with 33 different Challenge modes and a maximum level of 999 requiring 333,333 more XP after reaching Level 900. In Tableturf Battle, CPU opponents have three difficulty ranks and must be defeated on each rank three times to unlock the next one. Non-jellyfish CPU opponents reward sleeves after being defeated 30 times on the third difficulty rank. The priciest goods in the Grizzco shop are gold banners worth 333 fish scales each. In Wandercrust, some location requirements fit this theme, with locations like 33,333p every other spot in a journey needing 33,333p except for the final one at 33,333,333p. The Spire of Order has 30 floors split into three sections in Side Order, and color chips come in sets of three tones each. In Splatsville, there are three large screens showing different things. A playlist on the Nintendo Music app called "Top tracks" for Splatoon 3 features 33 songs.
