The film was directed by Jon Watts, a screenplay by Jonathan Goldstein and John Francis Daley, Watts and Christopher Ford, and Chris McKenna and Erik Sommers. The following June, Holland was chosen as a title character and Watts was hired to direct. This was followed shortly by taking Daley and Goldstein. In April 2016, the title of the film was revealed, along with an additional cast, including Downey in his role as MCU of Tony Stark / Iron Man. The main photography began in June 2016 at Pinewood Atlanta Studios in Fayette County, Georgia, and continued in Atlanta, Los Angeles and New York City. The other screenwriters were revealed during the shooting, which ended in Berlin in October 2016. The production team made efforts to differentiate the film from previous Spider-Man films. Spider-Man: Homecoming debuted in Hollywood on June 28, 2017, and was released in the United States on July 7 as part of the MCU Phase Three. Homecoming has reached a turnover of \$880 million worldwide, becoming the second Spider-Man film, the sixth film of 2017. When he discovers that the power core is an unstable grain of chitaur, he runs to the Washington monument, where the nucleus explodes and traps ned and their friends in an elevator. parker saves them, including his classmate and crushes liz. days later, in New York City, on board the staten island ferry, parker catches the new buyer of toomes mae gargan but toomes escapes and a malfunctioning weapon tears the ferry in half. stark helps parker saves passengers and confiscates his dress as punishment for his unconscionousness.
