Straighten it down the inside of your leg to the top of your shoe/foot. 2. ****Chest Measurement****: For adults, use the following chart to determine your jersey size: * Small: 38-40 in (M), 42-44 in (L) * Medium: 46-48 in (XL), 50-52 in (XXL) * Large: 54-56 in (3XL) * Youth sizes are also listed for baseball jerseys. 3. ****Hip Measurement****: Heels together and measure the fullest part of your hips, keeping the measuring tape level and parallel to the floor. ****Apparel Sizing Charts**** Use these charts to determine your size for men's and women's apparel: * Men's Apparel: Small (35-37 in, 29-31 in), Medium (38-40 in, 32-34 in), Large (41-43 in, 34-36 in), X-Large (44-46 in, 36-38 in), XX-Large (47-49 in, 38-40 in) * Women's Apparel: Small (35-36 in, 27-28 in), Medium (37-38 in, 29-31 in), Large (39-41 in, 32-34 in), X-Large (43 in, 36 in) * Youth Apparel: Sizing for children aged 6-14 years old * Toddler Apparel: Sizing for toddlers aged 2-5 years old * Newborn Apparel: Sizing for newborns up to 3 months ****Hat Size Chart**** Measure your head where a hat would typically sit, and use the chart below to determine your hat size: * Hat Sizes: 6 3/4, 7, 7 1/2, 8 * Head Circumference: 21 1/4", 22", 23", 24" The Chicago Cubs' home stadium Wrigley Field has been recognized as a National Historic Landmark. US Secretary of the Interior David L. Bernhardt announced the designation on Thursday, highlighting the ballpark's significant role in the city of Chicago and professional sports history. Built in 1914, Wrigley Field is the second-oldest ballpark in Major League Baseball and has hosted various events, including baseball's only "Double No-Hitter" in 1917. The stadium also introduced innovations such as allowing fans to keep hit balls as mementos and featuring an on-site organ for entertainment. The first video game was released in 1988, featuring games such as Pong and Space Invaders. In the US, there are around 2,600 recorded National Historic Landmarks, including famous sites like Mount Vernon, Pearl Harbor, and Alcatraz.
