Microsoft Word users can compare different document versions using the compare feature, combining revisions from various documents into one document. To compare two Word documents in MS Word: Open Microsoft Word Click the Review tab and select Compare in the Compare group Select the Compare feature from the drop-down list A Compare Documents dialog box will appear, allowing you to choose the original and revised documents. To compare two documents in Microsoft Word, follow these steps: Click on the drop-down arrow in the Original Document section and select Browse or Folder to locate the document you want to compare. Then, choose the Revised document from the Revised Document section using the same procedure. Click OK to open the document in a comparative interface. The interface consists of four sections: Revisions, Compared Document, and two document windows (Original and Revised). The first two sections display deleted, inserted, or changed text and highlight areas where changes were made, respectively. To analyze the changes, select a text or phrase from the Revision section to view its location in the Compared Document section. Click on the Review tab, then Display for Review button, and choose All Markup option. The All Markup feature displays all changes with red color. Viewing both document windows side by side reveals differences between them.
