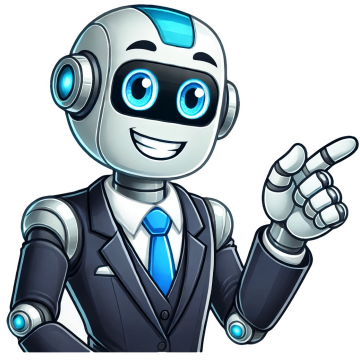

## Virgin atlantic change flight fee 2024

Airline award tickets offer flexibility that can't be matched by revenue tickets. This is because miles used for an airline award ticket can often be redeposited for a small fee or even free, depending on the program. In contrast, revenue ticket flexibility usually comes in the form of a credit towards a future ticket with an expiration date. Many airlines have improved their policies since the pandemic, making it easier to change or cancel award tickets. However, each frequent flyer program has its own set of rules and fees. Here's a list comparing some major airline programs: \* Air Canada Aeroplan: up to 100 CAD for changes, up to 150 CAD for cancellations \* Air France-KLM Flying Blue: €70 for changes, €70 for cancellations \* Alaska Mileage Plan: no change fees, no cancellation fees \* All Nippon Airways Mileage Club: no change fees, 3,000 miles for cancellations \* American AAdvantage: no change fees, no cancellation fees \* Avianca Lifemiles: \$150 for changes, \$50-200 for cancellations \* British Airways Executive Club: \$55 for changes, \$55 for cancellations \* Cathay Pacific Asia Miles: \$50 for changes, \$120 for cancellations \* Delta SkyMiles: no change fees, no cancellation fees \* Emirates Skywards: \$25 for changes, \$75 for cancellations \* Etihad Guest: up to 75% of miles for changes, up to 75% of miles for cancellations \* EVA Air Infinity MileageLands: \$50 for changes, \$50 for cancellations \* Finnair Plus: €50 for changes, €50 for cancellations \* Iberia Plus: €25 for changes, €25 for cancellations \* JetBlue TrueBlue: no change fees, no cancellation fees \* Qantas Frequent Flyer: 5,000 points for changes, 6,000 points for cancellations \* Qatar Privilege Club: \$25-100 for changes, \$25-100 for cancellations \* Singapore KrisFlyer: \$0-50 for changes, \$50-75 for cancellations \* Southwest Rapid Rewards: no change fees, no cancellation fees \* Turkish Miles&Smiles: \$70 for changes, \$70 for cancellations \* United MileagePlus: no change fees, no cancellation fees \* Virgin Atlantic Flying Club: \$100 for changes, \$100 for cancellations When booking an airline award ticket, it's essential to consider the policy of the program you're booking with, rather than the airline you'll be flying with. A change fee refers to altering the date or time of your flight, while a redeposit involves putting miles back into your account after canceling a ticket. Airline Award Change & Cancellation Policies: A Comparison of Popular Programs Given airline frequent flyer programs offer hundreds of options, but a closer look reveals that not all are created equal. When it comes to changing or canceling award tickets, each program has its own set of rules and fees. For awards to and from the United States, most programs allow for free cancellation within 24 hours of booking, providing flexibility for last-minute changes. Higher-tier elite members may also receive waived fees on awards, so it's essential to review the member benefits terms. Here's a breakdown of each program's policies: \* Air Canada Aeroplan: Tickets change for \$100 CAD, while redeposits cost \$150 CAD. Fees are lower for higher-priced awards, but refunds through the call center come with no discount. \* Air France-KLM Flying Blue: A single fee of €70 applies to changes or redeposits, regardless of direction of travel. \* Alaska Mileage Plan: No change or redeposit fees for award tickets, making it an attractive option. However, a \$12.50 partner award booking fee per direction of travel is non-refundable if canceled. \* All Nippon Airways (ANA) Mileage Club: Free changes to date and time allowed, but must be made at least 96 hours before departure. Redeposits involve paying 3,000 miles per ticket, with taxes and fees refunded. It's worth noting that most programs require changes or cancellations prior to the scheduled departure time of your flight, or the ticket will be forfeited. ANA first class American AAdvantage offers a great program for locking in speculative awards, especially with its partner awards that can be booked with miles. For AAdvantage, changes or cancellations must occur before scheduled departure time to avoid forfeit. Redeem AAdvantage miles for Qatar Airways business class. Avianca Lifemiles is popular for Star Alliance first & business class awards, with a change fee of \$150 and redepositing fees ranging from \$50-200. LifeMiles allows flexible changes or cancellations 24+ hours prior to departure. Registering for the program's subscription service waives change and cancellation fees. British Airways Executive Club offers many great partner award redemption options. Changing or redepositing Avios awards costs \$55, with an extra fee of \$25 for call center transactions, varying by region. Some quirk of canceling Avios awards: forfeiting taxes & fees is allowed to redeposit a ticket booked on American flights. Executive Club requires changes or cancellations at least 24 hours prior to departure. Redeem Avios for American first class. Cathay Pacific Asia Miles isn't ideal, but it offers decent redemption rates and flexibility in changing or canceling tickets after scheduled departure. Asia Miles charges \$50 or 7,500 miles for flight changes and \$120 or 17,000 miles for cancellations. Paying cash is the better option. For Asia Miles, flexible cancellation options are available within the ticket validity period. Delta SkyMiles doesn't have change or redeposit fees on North American reservations except when Booking Emirates First Class Awards with Different Airlines When it comes to booking first class awards, different airlines have varying policies and fees. Here's a comparison of the programs: For Delta SkyMiles, basic economy tickets are not as flexible, but there is no change or redeposit fee for North American-originating tickets. However, tickets changed or canceled after departure may result in forfeited tickets. Emirates Skywards charges up to \$25 for changing award flight dates and no cost to cancel Flex Plus awards. There is also an up-to-\$75 redeposit fee for awards, with no cost to cancel Flex Plus awards. Etihad Guest has the most punitive change and cancellation policies, charging 25% of miles required for cancellations within 21 days of departure, 50% between 8-21 days before departure, and 75% if canceled within 7 days. It's recommended to avoid this program due to its strict policies. Infinity MileageLands has a \$50 change or cancellation fee but allows more access to EVA Air business class award space. Redemptions are available without any fees. Finnair Plus charges €50 for changes or cancellations, with a 24-hour notice requirement before departure. Iberia Plus offers decent redemptions on Iberia flights with an €25 change or cancellation fee but partner award tickets can't be changed or canceled. It's recommended to transfer rewards to another Avios program for more flexible terms and better value. JetBlue TrueBlue no longer has any change or redeposit fees, making it a more flexible option for award bookings. The fees & taxes will be addd to the JetBlue Travel Bank and can be usd toward a futer flight. However, there's one exception - Blue Basic tickets with TrueBlue points, whish are subjected to a redeposit fee in case you need to cancel. TrueBlue ticket changers must give notice prior to flight schedualling time or else they'll forfeit the ticket. The alternative is to redeposit TrueBlue points, but that requires 5,000 points per person. For Qantas Frequent Flyer, changin your award ticket costs 5,000 points and cancellations cost 6,000 points, and you must do it at least 24 hours in advance. The Privilege Club has attractive redeposition prices on Qatar Airways - \$25 for changes made more than 24 hours before flight departure, and \$100 for those made between three to 24 hours. However, any cancellations done within three hours result in a complete forfeit of points, except for any taxes & fees you paid back. For Avios in Privilege Club, the redeposition prices vary depending on award type: Saver awards cost less than other types, with changin costing \$25-50 and redepositing costing \$75. KrisFlyer offers better deals for Singapore Airlines premium cabin flights but has variable redeposition costs. Southwest Rapid Rewards doesn't charge any fees for changin or redeposited award tickets. However, you must do it at least 10 minutes before flight departure or else the ticket will be forfeit. Turkish Miles&Smiles has some great deals on Turkish Airlines and partner airlines but charges \$70 for changin or redepositing any award ticket. United MileagePlus no longer has fees for award changes, making it a good option for speculativ Star Alliance awards. Virgin Atlantic Flying Club charges £70 in the UK and \$100 in the US for award changes and redeposits. Award tickets must be cancelled at least 24 hours before departure to avoid forfeiting points. Members can redeem their miles for Air New Zealand business class, offering discounted first and business class seats. Some frequent flyer programs have waived change or redeposit fees for awards, which is a significant advantage. When planning travel, especially speculative trips, it's essential to consider these policies. The author has positive experiences with Alaska Mileage Plan and American AAdvantage policies. Virgin Atlantic offers rebooking or re-routing options for impacted flights, including refunds of unused flights if travel hasn't commenced. However, partner airlines may charge extra baggage fees for checked-in bags exceeding their limit. For US destinations, Virgin Atlantic's baggage allowance applies, but check with the operating airline for unusual-sized baggage limitations.
